

## Factory tour at Ebnat AG

### General information

A factory tour offers you exclusive insights into our production and shows you how our brushes are manufactured with precision and experience. You can follow the entire manufacturing process of a brush step by step - from the initial processing to the finished product.

Ebnat AG produces high-quality household and oral hygiene products. You are probably already familiar with many of our products, even if they are not directly labelled with the Ebnat name.

**Note: The production of household brushes (tufting) has been relocated to Wattwil and is not part of the tour.**

## 1 Tour details

<b>Duration</b>	Approx. 2-2.5h
<b>Number of participants</b>	Min. 8, max. 30 persons  Large groups are divided into smaller groups.
<b>Possible start times</b>	Tours take place on Thursdays - Morning 08.30-09.15 am - Afternoon 01.30-02.15 pm
<b>Costs</b>	CHF 7.- per person (excl. VAT)  Each visitor will receive a voucher worth <b>CHF 10</b> , which can then be redeemed in our factory shop.
<b>Payment</b>	- No cash payment possible - The invoice will be sent a few days after the tour - Only the number of persons actually participating will be charged
<b>Communication</b>	As it can get loud in our production halls at times, every visitor is given a headset. This means that the tour guide speaking via a microphone is always easy to understand.
<b>Schedule</b>	- Welcome / Company video - Tour - Factory shop
<b>Factory shop</b>	At the end of the tour, you visit the Ebnat factory shop, where the voucher can be redeemed. The voucher cannot be exchanged for cash or redeemed at a later date.
